

Time Trax rolls out the Trax TraxCatcher line of products to record broadcast radio songs as individual MP3 files.



Time Trax Technologies, a maker of hardware and software products to record

content from radio broadcasts to individual <u>MP3 files</u>, announced a new product line at CES 2006 which combines a FM radio dock with a <u>MP3 player</u>.

The new Time Trax TraxCatcher line, of which the first model will be available in April for \$159.99, works by plugging it into a wall, tuning to a radio station and returning several hours later to remove the included, <u>portable MP3 player</u> from its docking slot to hear individual MP3s of each song recorded off the air. These songs can be transferred via a USB 2.0 connection to a computer for tagging with artist and song information. advertising

The first model is the entry level TraxCatcher Classic. Future models, which will range in price from \$99.99 to \$499.99, will include features such as HD radio, digital inputs and outputs, USB connectivity, MP3 docking capabilities, clock-radio functionality and satellite radio receiver integration.
