

Time Trax Developing Sirius Audio-Capture Product

Time Trax Technologies is developing a software product to enable Sirius Satellite Radio subscribers to capture and store audio feeds from the satcaster onto a personal computer. One source at TimeTrax told Billboard Radio Monitor to expect a Sirius-compatible product in 2005.

Time Trax CEO Elliott Frutkin wouldn't confirm the Sirius development directly, but he did tell Monitor, "TimeTrax has a trick or two up its sleeve right now as we grow very quickly. I can't talk about specifics, but we're hard at work making our software solution available to broader audiences."

In August, the company began selling its software that lets XM Satellite Radio subscribers capture and store audio feeds. The technology riled XM execs enough for the satcaster to alter its PC-based XM PCR product to prevent the capture of the digital feeds. Time Trax has now introduced software that works with the XM Direct tuner.
